Sur Jahan upholds the motto of 'Music for Peace, Music for All' and has been a people's festival, where till date musicians from 32 countries have performed in this festival.

Ale Möller, a celebrated Swedish musician, composer, and multiple Grammy winner, is renowned for his transformative impact on Scandinavian folk music and his role in expanding its global reach. Known for his versatility, Ale skillfully plays an array of instruments, including the mandolin, accordion, flute, shawm, and cowhorn.





With over five decades of history, Folkcorn is a pioneering Dutch folk ensemble founded in 1973, celebrated for its dedication to reviving and performing traditional Dutch music with authenticity and depth.





Founded in 2014, the Icelandic ensemble Umbra consists of four skilled musicians, offers a unique musical experience through their original arrangements of sacred and secular medieval tunes from Iceland and Europe, traditional Icelandic songs, and works by contemporary Icelandic composers.







The Folker Band honors Hungarian folk traditions with vibrant performances and compelling storytelling. Their distinctive combination of flute, violin, and koboz transports audiences through a range of songs, from heartfelt love ballads to powerful soldier's chants, creating an immersive experience that transcends generations and borders.

Sonia Shirsat, recipient of the 2016 Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar and Yuva Srujan Puraskar, is a renowned Fado singer from Goa. With 22 years of experience, she has performed in 19 countries and teaches Fado through her project, Fado de Goa.
