



Baul music, the soul of Bengal, blends philosophy and melody. Kangal Khyapa from Joydev Kenduli, a master dotara player, will lead a soulful performance with Nimai Khyapa (Murshidabad) and Arjun Khyapa (Nadia), featuring dotara, ektara, and captivating folk rhythms.
